1. Sleep is essential for a person's health and well-being. Yet millions of people do not get enough sleep and many suffer from lack of sleep. Most of those with these problems go undiagnosed and untreated. In addition, more than 40 per cent of adults experience daytime sleepiness severe enough to interfere with their daily activities at least a few days each month- with 20 per cent reporting sleepiness a few days a week or more. Furthermore, 69 per cent of children experience one or more sleep problems a few nights or more during a week.

2. If a sleep-deprived person doesn't sleep after the initial signs, the person may then start to experience apathy, slowed speech and flattened emotional responses, impaired memory and an inability to be novel or multitasking. As a person gets to the point of falling asleep, he or she will fall into micro sleeps (5-10 seconds) that cause lapses in attention, nod off while doing an activity like driving or reading and then finally experience hallucinations.

3. Everyone's individual sleep needs vary. In general, most healthy adults are built for 16 hours of wakefulness and need an average of eight hours of sleep a night. However, some individuals are able to function without sleepiness or drowsiness after as little as six hours of sleep. Others can't perform at their peak unless they've slept ten hours. And, contrary to common myth, the need for sleep doesn't decline with age but the ability to sleep for six to eight hours at one time may be reduced.

4. Stress is the number one cause of short-term sleeping difficulties, according to sleep experts. Common triggers include school or job-related pressures, a family or marriage problem and a serious illness or death in the family. Usually, the sleep problem disappears when the stressful situation passes. However, if short-term sleep problems such as insomnia aren't managed properly from the beginning, they can persist long after the original stress has passed.

5. Drinking alcohol or beverages containing caffeine in the afternoon or evening, exercising close to bedtime, following an irregular morning and nighttime schedule, and working or doing other mentally intense activities right before or after getting into bed can disrupt sleep.

6.If you are among the 20 per cent of employees in the United States who are shift workers, sleep may be particularly elusive Shift work forces you to try to sleep when activities around you-and your own biological rhythm-signal you to be awake. One study shows that shift workers are two to five times more likely than employees with regular, daytime hours so fall asleep on the job Groups that are at particular risk of sleep deprivation include night shift workers, physicians and truck drivers.

7. Travelling also disrupts sleep, especially jet lag and travelling across several time zones. This can upset your biological or circadian rhythms Environmental factors such as a room that's too hot or cold, too noisy or too brightly lit can be a barrier to sound sleep And interruptions from children or other family members can also disrupt sleep. Other influences to pay attention to are the comfort and size of your bed and the habits of your sleep partner. If you have to lie beside someone who has different sleep preferences, snoring, can't fall or stay asleep, or has other sleep difficulties, it often becomes your problem too!

INTRODUCTION

NEP 2020 lays particular emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each child. The rich heritage of ancient and eternal Indian knowledge and thought has been a guiding light for this policy.

The 10+2 structure in school education is modified with a new pedagogical and curricular restructuring of 5+3+3+4 system covering ages of 3-18 years.

Foundational stage ----3- 8 years (Balvatika 1, 2 & 3 & class 1/class 2)

Preparatory stage ---- 8- 11 years (classes 3, 4 & 5)

Middle stage ----- 11-14 years (classes 6, 7 & 8)

Secondary stage ----- 14-18 years (classes 9, 10, 11 & 12)

- 1) The policy gives highest priority in achieving universal Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, (FLN). PANCHAKOSHA Vikas (Five-fold development) is a keystone in the Indian tradition of the imagination of the development of human beings. The child is a whole being with Pancha koshas or five sheaths- Annamaya kosha (physical layer), Pranayama kosha (life force energy layer), Manomaya kosha (mind layer), Vijnanamaya kosha (intellectual layer) and Ananda maya kosha (inner self).
- 2) NEP 2020 aims to overcome the social status hierarchy associated with vocational education and requires integration of vocational education programmes into mainstream education in all education institutions in a phased manner. Towards this, secondary schools will also collaborate with ITIs, polytechnics, local industry, etc. Skill labs will also be set up and created in the schools in a hub and spoke model which will allow other schools to use the facility.
- 3) The Samagra Shiksha, an integral scheme for School Education as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme is being implemented and aims to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education at all levels of school education; Special emphasis given on Socially and Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs).
- 4) The medium of instruction until at least Grade 5, but preferably till Grade 8 and beyond, will be the home language/mother tongue/local language/regional language. Furthermore for exams and assessment it has been decided to conduct Board Exams on up to two occasions during any given school year, one main examination and one for improvement, if desired; setting up of a new National Assessment Centre, PARAKH (Performance Assessment, Review, and Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development) are important highlights.
- 5) Even though India has achieved almost universal enrollment in elementary education, a significant number of children fail to complete their education and are compelled to leave it in between. This increasing number of dropouts from school has received special mention in the much debated NEP, released on July 30, 2020. It says, "Through initiatives such as the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (now the Samagra Shiksha) and the Right to Education Act, India has made remarkable strides in the recent years in attaining near-universal enrolment in elementary education. However, the data for later grades indicates some serious issues in retaining children in the schooling system."

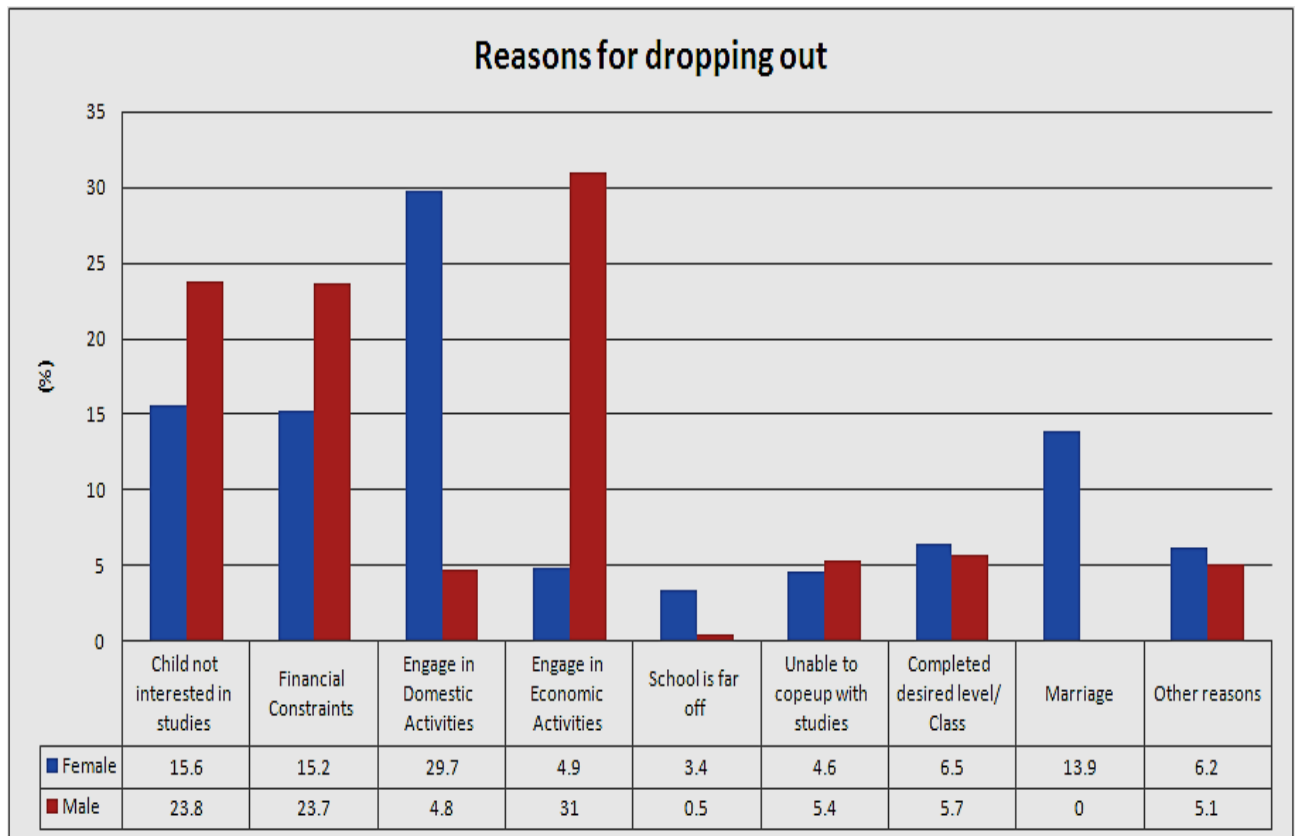
