The text shows fear can be challenged and conquered through persistent effort and self-belief. However, in Aunt Jennifer's Tigers, Aunt Jennifer does not gain such freedom. Patriarchal pressure continues to suffocate her spirit. Her own hands tremble even in art. Only the tigers she creates are bold, fearless and liberated — unlike her.
